1. Introduction

The Edmonton FASD Service Network Program was established in 1999. Currently there are 11 agencies with multiple programs across the Network, each providing a single point of entry for individuals with FASD and their caregivers who are seeking assistance. The Network is a community-based partnership of agencies working with individuals with FASD and their caregivers. They are responsible for developing and/or expanding FASD services in the areas of:

- Awareness and Prevention
- Assessment and Diagnosis
- Supports for Individuals and Caregivers

Due to the complex nature of FASD, individuals, families and caregivers often require a spectrum of programs and services. The Network was established to help coordinate access to FASD supports across the lifespan, to enhance existing FASD services, and to develop new ones where none existed.

The following document provides a report of the data collected, activities conducted, and where possible, outcomes achieved across the Service Network Program between April 2014 and March 2015. The data included in this report was retrieved from the FASD Online Reporting System (FASD-ORS) which is used by the service providers to report on services provided to clients in the networks. The purpose of this report is to provide a complete picture of the valuable work that is being done across the network service area to prevent FASD, to assess and diagnose individuals, and to support individuals with FASD.

2. Edmonton Fetal Alcohol Network
