- Bissell Centre: Hope Terrace

Funding to hire a clinical counselor to support the 34 residents with FASD at Hope Terrace. The counselor will be provided with an office and hold once-weekly office hours for residents to receive in-house mental health counseling services when readiness and need arise. We are seeking this grant to cover the professional fees associated with hiring the clinician. This is a total of \$225 per week for 22 weeks. \$4950 Motion (Lisa) to approve the funding allocation, seconded (Robbie), passed.

- CSS, Step By Step (15 individuals)

The Step By Step / First Steps program is hoping to provide a teaching opportunity, where 15 participants will cook a meal together to be enjoyed as a group, after also preparing slow cooker freezer meals for later use.

- Working on Feb 1, 2023 Jan 31, 2024 yearend report.
- Year 4 of the 5 year project has begun.
- New Research & Resources
- Towards Healthy Outcomes 2.0
- Person centered, strength-based approach, geared toward goal attainment and growth.
- Facilitate intervention planning across the lifespan.
- Restructured framework to include 10 domains (from 12)
- Combined 'family cohesion' and 'attachment' = Attachment and relationship domain
- This new domain highlights the value of early attachment experiences alongside familial and support stability and relationships across the lifespan.
- The new *Interdependence* domain is a combination of the original Adaptive Functioning and Community Engagement domains. The concept of **interdependence** was introduced to us through work with community members, including individuals with FASD and caregivers, and refers to finding the balance between support and autonomy with individuals. It exists along a spectrum and fluctuates across the lifespan.
- Each domain is now broken into three sections, which we hope will increase the practicality of the content and enable individuals with living experiences to:

Learn about essential developmental domains and their contributions to lifelong functioning.

Understand how development may be uniquely impacted for individuals with FASD.

Enact FASD-informed approaches to intervention and support based on current FASD resources and research evidence.
